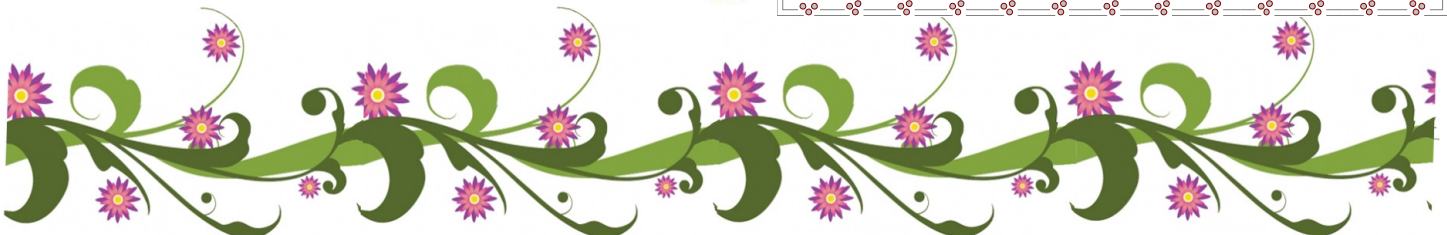

HEARD AT THE APRIL HCC BOARD MEETING

There is \$7,850.61 in the HCC treasury after expenditures of \$2271.83 for Brentwood Days free events. This is similar to what was spent last year. (ELS also provided \$400 for the entertainment.)

Last fall, the board decided to make better use of the funds in our Community Assistance Program (CAP) by making donations to worthwhile charitable groups instead of to needy individuals. This month, they changed its name to Charitable Activity Fund (CAF), which reflects this function.

Bruce Williams will head up a committee that will gather together familiar songs and print them in booklet form for residents to use when we have community songfests.

The board decided to buy two new speakers for \$460. These are the best we can get for our needs and the price was greatly discounted, thanks to the efforts of Bruce Williams.

The board discussed complaints about the present street sweeper, who leaves sidewalks and driveways cluttered with stones, etc.--which the residents then sweep back into the street. This has been brought to the attention of the management and they are working on the issue.

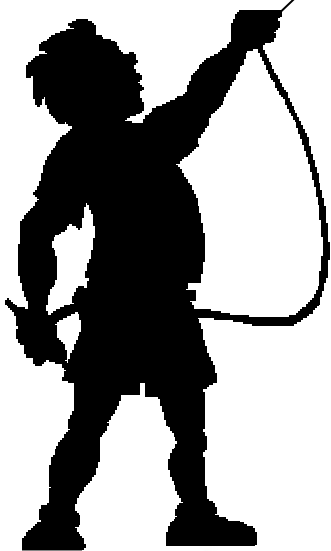

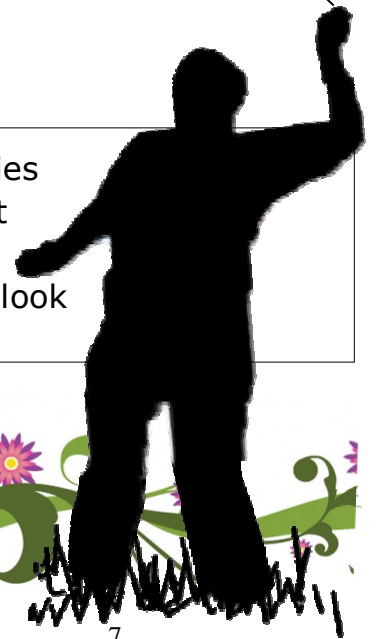
Regular golf will continue all summer on Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays but the starting time will change as the weather gets warmer. The next tournament will be in November.
