The couple have know each other since they were 14 and 13. They were friends, part of the same group in Ottawa. And then he went away to school. She stayed, married, and had five children. While Max was getting a couple of degrees in agriculture, he also married and eventually had four children. “But I kept track of Cookie,” Max says, “And when my wife died, I looked her up.”

Max has had several careers. His most rewarding one included helping a group of farmers develop an egg monopoly. The project became so successful it was copied many times over. “He was the egg farmer’s hero.” Cookie smiles proudly. A group of projects, sponsored by his own company, took Max to Africa for ten years. “It’s great to go to different countries and see how people live.”

Meanwhile, Cookie became a single mother, working several jobs to make ends meet. She remarried, but eventually lost that husband as well as two grown children, all to different causes.

“By the time I came back to reclaim her, she had made a comfortable single life for herself,” Max says. “However, I soon convinced her to give that up!”

Cookie looks at him and smiles. “We got married on the way to the airport,” she says and then adds, “We were going out of town to visit friends. Before we left, we called to arrange a wedding at the court house for when we returned. ‘We have time today,’ the clerk said.

Max takes up the narrative. “And so I called my son and Cookie called a friend. We all met at the courthouse and had the wedding, and then Cookie and I left to catch our plane.”

After the couple married, Max decided he wanted to move. Cookie wanted to see Ireland and so that’s where they went. “I gave my company to my kids.” He grins. “And my house, too. I bought them off! And then we escaped to Ireland.” They’ve never been sorry. “The Irish are so friendly,” Cookie says.

They live in Dublin where they walk everywhere. There’s always the pubs, and friends, and community events. “But mostly,” Cookie says, “Max writes and I knit.”

“I couldn’t write without Cookie’s support,” Max says. “In fact, she’s the one who got me started again after she read something I’d written in college.”

“But its not one-sided,” Cookie insists. “Max is so good for me; he makes me laugh. I’ve never been so happy in my life.” The two smile at each other, a mutual admiration society of two.

Max has published several books both here and in Ireland. His latest is *God’s Thunder in the Sky*.
